



Issue Update

\$127 Million in New Infrastructure

The federal and provincial government have announced 35 new “green” infrastructure projects under the Canada-British Columbia Infrastructure Program. The total value of these projects will be close to \$127 million. They are as follows:

Cariboo

- Fraser-Fort George – construction of a community sewer system \$314,000
- McBride – upgrades to sewer system \$125,000

Kootenay Region

- Castlegar – construction of a duplicate portion of the sewage treatment plant \$2.7 Million
- Fernie – replace and extend a water trunk main \$627,000
- Invermere – construction of a water reservoir \$1.4 Million
- East Kootenay – improvements to wastewater treatment \$428,000
- Midway – convert sewage plant to extended aeration plant \$805,000

Mainland/Southwest Region

- Burnaby – waste water system upgrades, construction of storm sewer pipes \$9.5 Million
- Chilliwack – waste water system upgrades \$3.04 Million
- Pemberton – waste water system upgrades, construction of new treatment plant \$3.9 Million
- Kent – develop a groundwater source and storage reservoir \$6 Million
- Whistler – waste water system upgrades \$12.7 Million
- Gibsons – waste water system upgrades \$2.4 Million
- Harrison Hot Springs – improvements to sewer systems \$435,000

North Coast

- Prince Rupert – replace sewer lines \$980,000

Thompson-Okanagan

- Armstrong – install new concrete culvert \$82,000
- Summerland – construct water treatment facilities \$7.6 Million
- Logan Lake – improvements to water system \$45,000
- Enderby – extend water system \$100,000
- Golden – sewage treatment plant upgrades \$1.2 Million
- Oliver – expansion of water irrigation system \$1.2 Million
- Cache Creek – renewal and replacement of sewer treatment works \$947,000
- Lumby – complete water systems upgrades \$1.2 Million

Vancouver Island/Coast

- Colwood – water quality improvements \$832,000
- Comox – construct a storm water detention pond \$1.25 Million
- Duncan – improvements to wastewater collection systems \$979,000
- Esquimalt – water quality improvements \$696,000
- Langford – construction of sewer collection system \$3.4 Million
- Metchosin – extend community water service \$600,000
- North Cowichan – three production wells, pump house \$2.4 Million
- Port Alice – replace current reservoir \$245,000
- Sooke – install a community sewage collection system \$11.6 Million
- Sidney – upgrades to water system \$649,000
- Tahsis – install culvert \$280,000
- Tofino – water system upgrades \$4 Million
